CAT Refund Policy

A 100% refund will be given for any request received prior to the closing date for trial entries. Request for refunds of entry fees received after the closing date up to the day before the trial will be honored less any expense incurred by CAT for the following reasons: dog in heat; injured or ill dog (with verification from vet on request); or family emergency.

Class Descriptions

Standard Agility: A standard agility course consists of a numbered sequence of obstacles. It demonstrates a dog/handler team's speed, accuracy, and teamwork.

All non-standard classes are scored pursuant to the provisions of Section 6 & 7 of USDAA Rules and Regulations.

Gamblers Class: The competition consists of a course with no pre-determined route and each obstacle is assigned a point value. In the 'opening' period the handler seeks to accumulate points by performing the obstacles of his / her choice in the time allotted. At the conclusion of the 'opening' the handler attempts the 'gamble', a sequence designated by the judge to be handled from a distance, for additional points.

Jumpers Class: This class consists of a course of jumps and may include a tire and tunnels.

Snooker Class: This class has an 'opening' sequence of point collection similar to the Gamblers followed by a closing sequence of a set pattern. Roughly parallels the billiards game of 'Snooker', requiring the dog to successfully complete a 'red' jump prior to attempting an obstacle designated as any other color.

Pairs Relay: This class consists of a standard course with one dog and handler running a portion of the course, followed by a baton exchange to a second handler and dog who run the second portion of the course. To be pairs partners:

- Dogs must be from the same class, i.e. mini or open height class and,
- Partners must be from the same level, i.e. Starter/Novice, Advanced, Masters, PI, PII, or PIII

Championship & Performance Jump Heights

The following are the jump heights for the Championship program with the Performance heights in parentheses.

Awards

Standard - Championship & Performance

1st through 4th place rosettes awarded in each jump height for all classes. Maroon rosettes will be awarded for qualifying scores.

Non-standard - Championship & Performance

1st through 4th place rosettes awarded in each jump height; Starter/Novice combined for these awards; pairs will be awarded by mini and open divisions.

Maroon rosettes will be awarded for all qualifying scores.

Junior Handler Program

Junior Handlers will receive gold, silver or bronze medallions based on faults earned.

A maroon qualifying rosette will be awarded for qualifying (zero fault) rounds.

Grand Prix placement rosettes will be awarded to 3 places for each jump height. All dogs earning a qualifying score will receive a maroon and white qualifying ribbon.

USDAA® Grand Prix of Dog Agility® Local Qualifier

This class is open to all dogs regardless of title or skill level - a single-round tournament featuring the sport in its basic form. The course includes an A-frame, dog walk or cross-over, see-saw, pipe tunnel, collapsed tunnel, weave poles, tire jump and a variety of other jumps and hurdles. Scoring follows regulations for standard scoring under Masters rules, except that time standards may generally range from 3.50 yards per second to 3.75 yards per second for dogs competing in the 22" and 26" height classes and from 2.85 to 3.00 yards per second in the 12" height class and from 3.00 to 3.25 yards per second for dogs competing in the 16" height class. Dogs that earn seven (7) or fewer faults (combined course and time penalties) shall qualify to enter one of the Regional Championship events. Two (2) qualifying rounds of seven (7) faults or less (one of which may be earned at a Regional Championship) are required for entry to the World Championship quarterfinals. A complete copy of the 2003 tournament rules, which are hereby incorporated by reference, will be posted at the event, or may be obtained directly from USDAA.

Notice to Competitors

Competitors through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of USDAA rules and regulations, as amended January 1, 2002, which are hereby incorporated by reference, including but not limited to, the following rules and conditions for submission and acceptance of entry:

- This test is open to all dogs being at least 18 mos. of age, including purebred and non-purebred, except bitches in season, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance, or dogs exhibiting signs of aggression.
- All dogs must be registered with USDAA in order to compete in USDAA sanctioned events. Registration may be made concurrently with entry to this show, a form for which is included in this Agility Test Schedule. Additionally, junior handlers must be separately registered with a "J" prefix to compete in the Junior Handler Program classes offered at this test.
- No leads or collars, food, toys, or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at anytime, except as provided for in USDAA Rules & Regulations.
- All dogs must be kept on leash at all times, except while competing in the ring or in the warm-up jump area.
- Safety shall always be of foremost consideration in actions and conduct by handlers at all times.
- The organizing committee may refuse any entry for any reason.
- FAULT LIMITS may be imposed at the discretion of the organizing committee.
- All competitors through entry at this event waive any and all rights relative to video broadcast of this event. Competitors shall have the right to videotape portions of this event for their personal use only. No portion of this event may be videotaped for commercial or other purposes. All video, broadcast and telecast rights for this event are the exclusive property of United States Dog Agility Association, Inc. Portions of this event may be taped for television. Through entry at this event, all competitors and handlers hereby grant to USDAA and its representatives, agents and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate his/her and their dog's name, biography, likeness, photograph, voice, performing persona, or other indication of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or media now known or hereafter to become known. All competitors and handlers hereby release USDAA and its representatives, agents and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right.
- No entries may be accepted, changed, altered or withdrawn after the closing date, except for those of bitches that come into season.
- No entry fee will be refunded if the Test cannot open or be completed by reason of riot, civil disturbance, fire, act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strike or any other cause beyond the control of the organizers. See below for club's refund policy.
- Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry. There will be a \$20.00 service charge for returned checks. Payment of entry fees and service charges shall be made in cash or money order within 30 days of postmark of notice of returned check where notification is received after event date. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice result in cancellation of event results for all classes for the registration number(s) of delinquent entry/entries. No reinstatement of results is possible, and all awards must be returned within 10 days of notification, or the dog's registration may be suspended pending restitution. Any unpaid fees

USDAA Agility Titling Program

All classes will be scored under the provisions laid out in the USDAA Rules & Regulations.

Championship Dog Agility Program

The Championship Program classes are for dogs not entered in the Performance Program at this event. Classes include standard agility, gamblers, jumpers, pairs relay, and snooker agility as set forth in USDAA rules and regulations, each of which are conducted at three competitive levels, as listed below: The Starters/Novice level classes shall be for any dogs that have not earned the *Agility Dog*[®] title. When offered separately as Starters and Novice classes, the starters level classes are for dogs that have also not earned a title in the Performance Program, or a dog that is handled by a person who has not previously earned the *Agility Dog*[®] title or a title in the Performance or Veterans Program with any dog. The Advanced level classes shall be for dogs that have earned the *Agility Dog*[®] title and not have earned the *Advanced Agility Dog*[®] title. The Masters level classes shall be for dogs that have earned the *Advanced Agility Dog*[®] Title. Additionally, a dog that has received two qualifying scores in one Advanced level nonstandard agility class (i.e., Snooker, Jumpers, Gamblers or Pairs Relay), with scores being earned from two different judges (and with two different partners in pairs relay), shall be eligible for entry into the same Masters level nonstandard class without having earned the *Advanced Agility Dog*[®] title.

Performance Program Classes

Performance Program classes are open to dogs not entered in the Championship Dog Agility Program at this agility test. Classes include standard performance, gamblers performance, jumpers performance and snooker performance as defined in the USDAA rules and regulations. Generally, Performance Level I, Level II, and Level III are run on courses used for Starters, Advanced and Masters classes, respectively, with the following exceptions: the A-frame is set at 5'6", jump heights are one height class lower as set forth in "Notice to Competitors," no spread hurdles are utilized and time standards in the standard and jumpers classes are extended by 3 seconds beyond that utilized in the Championship Program. Eligibility for entry is determined as follows:

The Performance I classes shall be for any dog that has not yet earned the Performance Dog ISM title.

The Performance II classes shall be for any dog that has earned the Performance Dog I title, the *Agility Dog*[®] title or the *Veteran Agility Dog*SM title but has not earned the Performance Dog IISM title.

The Performance III classes shall be for any dog that has earned the Performance IISM title, the *Advanced Agility Dog*[®] title, or the *Veteran Advanced Agility Dog*SM title. Additionally, a dog that has received two qualifying scores from two different judges, in either (1) Level II nonstandard classes, (2) Advanced level nonstandard classes, or (3) Veterans level nonstandard classes.

Junior Handler Titling - (Use separate entry form)

This program is for children eighteen years of age and younger. Four progressive levels of competition are offered to foster advancement in training and to provide recognition for junior handler accomplishments in dog agility. The levels are:

Beginners Class: Dog/handler teams not having earned the JH Beginners AgilitySM certificate are eligible for entry to this class. Completion of one round within the stipulated time without fault shall earn the JH Beginners AgilitySM certificate of accomplishment. Dogs may compete on or off leash (must be stipulated on the entry form) and handlers must complete a 10-question test. Answers will be reviewed prior to the start of the class. The obstacle course shall be comprised of ten obstacles (A-frame apex at 4'6", table set at 12" for all jump heights, pipe and collapsed tunnels and six hurdles) with a standard course time of 60 seconds. Dogs competing on leash jump a maximum height of 16".

Elementary Class: Dog/handler teams having earned the JH Beginners AgilitySM certificate but not having earned the JH Elementary AgilitySM certificate are eligible for entry to this class. Completion of two rounds within the stipulated time without fault shall earn the JH Elementary AgilitySM certificate of accomplishment. Dogs may compete with a buckle collar, but must be off leash. The same obstacles and related modifications shall be used as in the Beginners class, except the A-frame shall measure 5'0" at the apex.

Intermediate Class: Dog/handler teams having earned the JH Elementary AgilitySM certificate but not having earned the JH Intermediate AgilitySM certificate are eligible for entry to this class. Completion of three rounds within the stipulated time without fault shall earn the JH Intermediate AgilitySM certificate of accomplishment. Course shall include twelve to fourteen obstacles (A-frame set at 5'6", dog walk, pipe and collapsed tunnels, 5-6 weave poles, table (set at 12"/16"), long jump, tire jump, 4-6 hurdles) with a standard course time of 75 seconds.

Senior Class: Dog/handler teams having earned the JH Intermediate AgilitySM certificate are eligible for entry to this class. Completion of three rounds within the stipulated time without fault shall earn the JH Senior AgilitySM certificate of accomplishment. Course shall include thirteen to fifteen obstacles (A-frame set at 6'0"/5'6" for dogs jumping 8", dog walk, see-saw, pipe and collapsed tunnels, 5-6 weave poles, table (set at 12"/16"), long jump, tire jump 4-6 hurdles) with a standard course time computed at two yards per second not to exceed 75 seconds.
